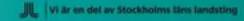

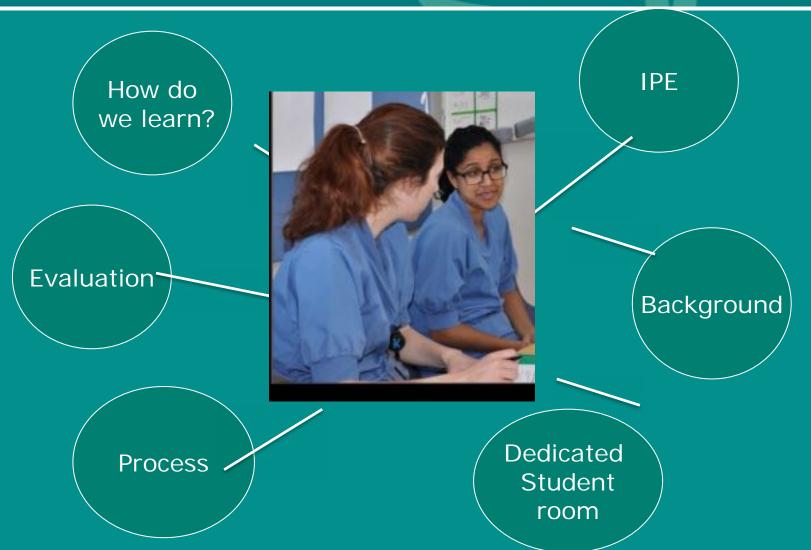

Develop understanding of the roles of other workers.

Instil in learners the need to safeguard the individual, family or community when care is endangered by health care personnel. Develop awareness of ethical issues of other professions.

Provide guidelines, position statements and discussion for related to safeguarding people when their care is endangered by health care personnel.

Good team work in ICU is essential for the patient



- The different working rotations from staff causes a lack consistency in the team
- The leaders role is important
- There are studies showing that effective collaboration can influence the outcome for critical ill patients.

Errors

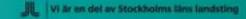
Errors occur because of lack of team communication

- Communication errors occured in 37 % in observation study of ward rounds (Donchin et al.,1985)
- 30% of specific information was lost between OR team (Lingard ,2004)
- Exended length of surgery (Gillespie 2012)

In OR Communication: Time out protocols

Allows the entire surgical team to verify the correct identity of the patient, procedure, and site.





Evidence Cochran Reviews

- Review year 2002 = 0 foundings
- Review 6 studies 2007 = 4 positive outcome
- Review 15 studies 2013 = 7 med positive result
- 4 with mixed results and 4 no impact at all.

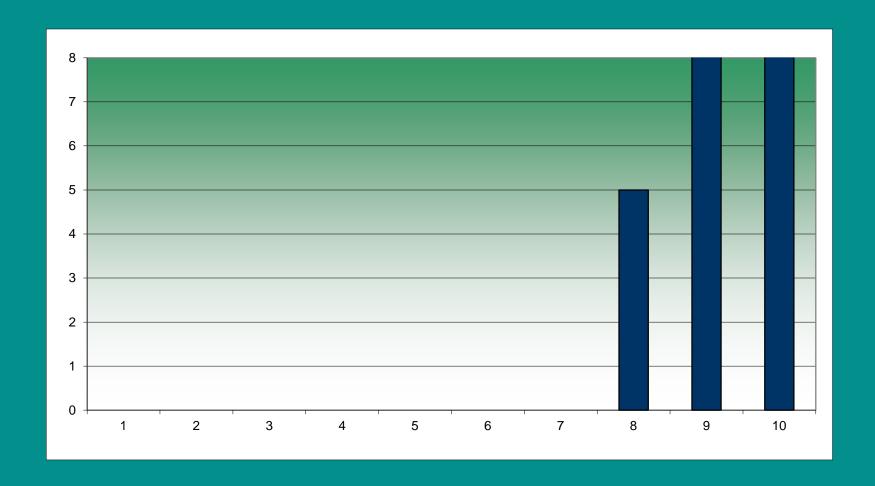

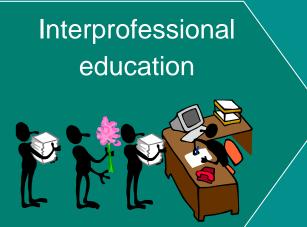

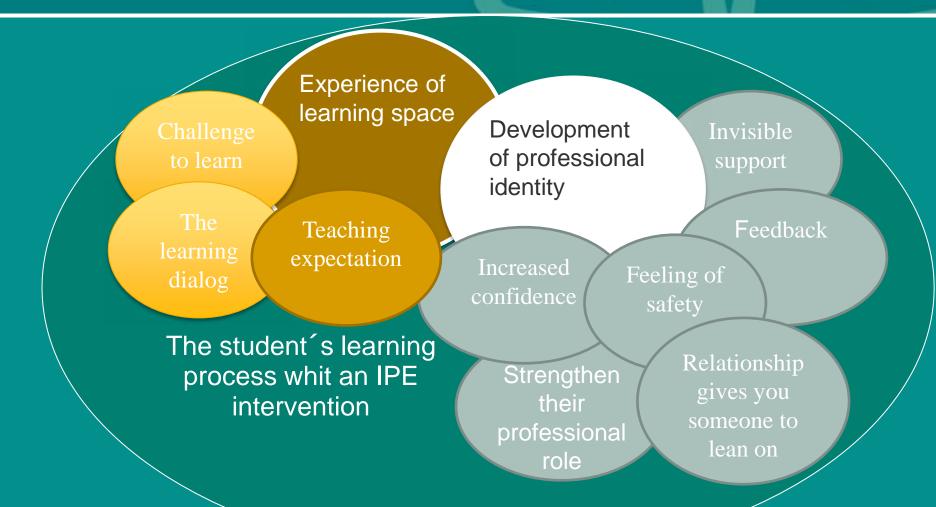
